Key Dates

Due dates for registering new Scouts joining Troop are extended – contact Mrs. Rehm

March 29	\$50 deposit & online registration due for Early Bird discount for existing Scouts
May 25	Final payment, Medical Record, & Medications entered online due (earlier is better, much earlier is much better) <i>After this date, NO refunds will be made on the Camp Fee</i>
June 19 to 24	Off to camp for a week of fun!

Registration Process

All registrations are handled online through the Troop Portal. This is necessary to handle the complexity and scale of administration for an event with typically 70 Scouts, ten or more adult leaders, and 120 potential class choices (each with unique registration requirements). Please do not ask the Troop leaders to handle the registration for you. (There will be an introduction to the Portal made available.)

Scouts must be registered with the Troop and entered into TroopMaster before a Portal account is created for them. If you cannot access the Portal, start by reviewing the Portal FAQs on the Troop website. If that does not solve the problem, please contact webmaster@Troop137.com providing your name, your Scout's name. If you are not registered, you will be told.

If your Scout will take any medication (over-the-counter or prescription) during camp, the medication section of the Summer Camp online registration must be completed. If there are any updates, they can be made online. Note that before the Scout goes to camp, the Medication Card must be printed from the Portal, signed, and turned in. Medications cannot be brought/sent to camp without the medication card and entry into the Portal.

All Scouts and adults attending camp must have a Medical Form submitted to the summer camp coordinator by the due date (above) to attend. The Medical Form must be signed by the physician within 12 months of the end of camp (must be signed after last June). Older forms are not valid.

During registration, the total fees owed (see information below) will be displayed on the main enrollment page for summer camp on the Portal. There also is a link which will display a detail of how

the balance is calculated if needed. Adding and removing certain classes will change the fees owed as some classes have special fees.

There is a minimum skill level indicated for each merit badge; **the online system will only present choices appropriate to the Scout's rank, age and camp experience.** In limited situations, Scouts can be scheduled for merit badges not recommended for their camper year by special request, but please use good judgment before asking. Remember, your son will have more fun if they are in a program with other Scouts they know and at a level they can handle.

Your Scout will not have any class confirmed until the deposit is paid. At that time, the classes are entered into the Council system if slots are still available. Once confirmed, your Scout's schedule will be locked and any further changes will require contact with the summer camp Coordinator. Note that if you change a confirmed class, there is no guarantee that it will be available later to switch back.

Fee Schedule for the Camping Program

Please do not let fees stop any Scout from attending camp. For scouts who are unable to pay the camp fee a Council Scholarship or Troop Scholarship are possible. Please see Mrs. Rehm or Mr. Green for assistance in this matter.

If you have a new Scout...

then we highly suggest that you sign-up for the Green Bar program, generally the Second Class or First Class offering. This program will allow a Scout working on Tenderfoot, Second Class, and/or First Class to largely complete the rank advancement at camp. Taking Green Bar, there is still time in the schedule for merit badges. It isn't always possible, but we recommend taking Green Bar in the morning hours when it is cooler. Scouts must remember to bring their Handbook to camp and check in with adults each day to review and have items signed as they do them.

If you have a returning Scout who has NOT earned 1st Class rank...

then we suggest considering the Green Bar for your next rank, so you can make an advancement at camp. Again, with Green Bar, there is still an opportunity to complete merit badges as well.

If you have a returning Scout who has already earned 1st Class rank...

then he has a couple of choices. He can sign-up for 5 Merit Badges or, if he is 13 years old, sign-up for Basic COPE and a couple of Merit Badges. If he is planning to do Basic COPE, we recommend signing up for the morning Basic COPE program; it is much cooler in the morning.

If you have a Scout who has taken Basic COPE...

then he also has a couple of choices. He can sign-up for 5 Merit Badges or sign-up for Advanced COPE and a couple of Merit Badges.

Again this year we plan to offer the swim test before we go to Boxwell. We encourage everyone going to Boxwell to complete the swim test **before** we get there. This will speed up the sign in process on the first day (Sunday) at Boxwell, but remember the Boxwell swim staff can require another test at camp (though they have not asked anyone tested through our pre-camp testing to re-test the last few years).

All Boy Scouts are required to have a current medical record on file **by the time of summer camp**. Please use the standard Health and Medical Record form available on the Troop web site under "Summer Camp".

We need several adults who are not attending camp to come up on Tuesday night to stay with the Scouts for the evening so that our adults who are attending for the week may attend a special dinner for the camping leaders. We at least owe those adults spending the week at camp that one meal without the Scouts....

And we need adult leaders/parents to attend summer camp with the Troop. If you can go to camp please complete the Adult Registration on the Troop portal. We need at least 6 to 8 adults always there to help make sure things are progressing nicely. Adults can stay the entire week or a portion of the week, but we must have adult help. Come and stay some, you will enjoy it. (Did we mention the Tuesday dinner for you?)
